

College Admissions Test Taking Time Line.....

Take the PSAT. (optional)

Explore the ACT and SAT.

Study for the PSAT. Grade Take the PSAT. Determine whether to take the ACT or the 11th SAT. Prep for the ACT/SAT. Take the ACT/SAT.

Take the ACT/SAT again if needed.
Apply to colleges.
Get in to college!



What is the purpose of the PSAT

- ➤ A practice SAT
- National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test for juniors only
- NOT used for college admissions. Will not reported on your college application




PSAT Score Back Timeline.....

- > Administered in early October.
- ➤ First week of December 2018— PSAT Scores accessible to school counselors
- ➤ By the Second week of December 2018 PSAT scores available to students through the College Board's electronic portal. www.collegeboard.org




PSAT Score Distribution Range: 320-1520





National Merit National Data from 2016 PSATs






What's a Good PSAT Score?

PSAT Sections	College & Career Readiness Benchmark for 10 th Grade	College & Career Readiness Benchmark for 11 th Grade
Evidence-Based Reading & Writing	430	460
Math	480	510

Scoring above the Benchmark gives a 75% likelihood of achieving a <u>C</u> or better in first year college courses.

Math Section	 Three areas of concentrated focus: Problem solving and data analysis Algebra Advanced Math 55 minutes with a Calculator 25 minutes without a Calculator

Category	Features
Essay	 Essay is <u>optional</u> 50 minutes Requires students to analyze a 650-750 word document and explain how the author builds an argument.



Omitted Question: 0 points

• Incorrect Answer: 0 points

You won't be penalized. Every point helps

SAT Subject Tests



SAT Subject Tests

- >1-hour standardized test on individual subjects (formally known as the SAT II's)
- ➤Offered on same test dates as standard SAT- Up to three can be taken at a time, on a different day as the full length SAT.
- Approximately 200 universities, colleges and /or programs require SAT Subject Tests for admission purposes. Considered by others if included on application.
- Selective colleges usually require or recommend scores from at least two SAT Subject Tests. Speak to your counselor about any schools of interest that may require SAT Subject Tests.
- >20 different SAT Subject tests are offered in 5 general subject areas:

English
History
Languages
Mathematics
Science (Biology, Chemistry, Physics)

Reading	35 minutes, 40 questions

Optional Essay	Requires analysis of 3 different perspectives , 40 minutes long, optional






Reading Passage Topics SAT vs.ACT

Similarities Between the Tests

SAT & ACT Both used for college admissions

Used for scholarships + merit-based grants

Can retake several times

Colleges accept both

Typically taken Spring of junior year + Fall of senior year

Approx three to four hours long

Optional essay


No wrong answer penalty

Reading	More Social Studies Reading	More Science Reading		
Math	More data analysis	More geometry		
	No calculator section	Calculator use allowed		
Scoring	50% math, 50% verbal	25% math, 50% verbal 25% science




